### **Re: Prayer for Urgent Intervention Regarding Non-Response to Representations on Long Pending Pension & Retiree Welfare Issues of Bank Pensioners**

We respectfully submit this representation seeking urgent intervention of the Hon'ble Prime Minister's Office in a matter concerning lakhs of retired employees of Banks across the country.

The All India Bank Retirees' Federation (AIBRF), a registered all-India organization representing 3lakhs bank retirees, has submitted **eight detailed representations** during the last two months to:

- **Department of Financial Services (DFS), Ministry of Finance**
- **Reserve Bank of India**
- **Indian Banks' Association**

These representations relate to critical issues including pension updation, parity concerns, dearness relief anomalies, regulatory oversight, and establishment of a structured grievance redressal mechanism for retirees.

However, despite the seriousness of the issues and their wide impact, **none of the representations have been acknowledged or replied to by the above authorities.**

**Grounds for Seeking PMO Intervention**

## 1. **Administrative Silence on Social Security Issues**

Pension is not a charity but a deferred wage and a measure of social security. **Continued non-response undermines principles of transparency and accountable governance.**

## 2. **Impact on Senior Citizens**

Bank retirees are senior citizens who served nationalized banking institutions for decades and contributed to nation-building and financial inclusion.

## 3. **Regulatory & Policy Oversight Concerns**

The issues raised require coordinated action between DFS, RBI and IBA. In the absence of inter-institutional accountability, matters remain unattended.

## 4. **Erosion of Trust**

Prolonged silence erodes confidence of retirees in institutional grievance redress mechanisms.

In view of the above, AIBRF humbly prays that the Hon'ble PMO may kindly:

1. Direct the Department of Financial Services to examine and dispose of the eight representations in a time-bound manner.
2. Instruct the concerned authorities to formally communicate their decisions **with reasoned responses.**
3. Consider instituting a structured and permanent mechanism for addressing bank retiree pension and welfare issues at the national level.

The issue is not adversarial but one of fairness, dignity and administrative responsiveness towards senior citizens who devoted their working lives to public sector banking.

We trust that under the dynamic and sensitive leadership of the Hon'ble Prime Minister, the matter will receive urgent attention and justice will be rendered.
