Re: Tragic Rail Accident in Balasore, Odisha on 02.06.2023

Re: AIBRF tribute to hundreds of people who lost their lives in the accident

As we all are aware that very tragic and painful rail accident had occurred in Balasore (Odisha) on 02.06.2023 when three trains collided near the city of Balasore, in the state of Odisha in eastern India. Two passenger trains, the 12841 Coromandel Express and the 12864 SMVT Bengaluru–Howrah SF Express, collided after an initial collision involving a goods train.

2. 288 precious human lives have been lost so far as per the official figures released by Railways and more than 1100 passengers have been injured and have been admitted in hospitals for treatment. Some of them are critically serious.

3. It is one of the worst rail accidents occurred in the history of Indian Railways. Entire nation is under great shock and grief. Enquiries including CBI investigation have been instituted to ascertain cause of the accident.
